

### President's Welcome

Each NAACP member makes a difference to the complex, ongoing work of advancing racial equity. We have driven the hardest-fought wins for civil rights and social justice — with you by our side, we can accelerate the next milestones for Black Americans.

The Cheltenham Area Branch NAACP is leading the fight to ensure that Black lives are a priority in all spaces. From police brutality to COVID-19 to voter suppression, Black communities are under attack. We work to disrupt inequality, dismantle racism, and accelerate change in key areas including criminal justice, health care, education, climate, and the economy.

Our commitment to becoming an anti-racist organization requires our organization to be on a constant, ongoing racial equity journey—a continuous culture of learning, reflecting, and, when appropriate, an evolution in the way that we understand, think, and write about people and communities most marginalized by White supremacy and racist policies and institutions.

In 1889, American sociologist, and Co-Founder of the NAACP, W.E.B Dubois made a statement that pushed back against writing "Negro" with a lowercase "n," saying "eight million Americans deserve a capital letter." "Say it loud I'm Black and I'm proud" became a popular phrase (popularized by James Brown's original ballad) of the Civil Rights Movement. Just recently, The New York Times journalist Nikole Hannah-Jones emphasized the importance of language as a tool to reclaim Black humanity by requiring writers to refer to enslaved Black Americans as "enslaved" rather than "slaves" in the 1619 Project. The use of language has historically and contemporaneously signified how Blackness and anti-Blackness is understood and functions in the United States.

The Cheltenham Area Branch NAACP will continue to work towards the above-mentioned initiatives. When it comes to civil rights and social justice, we have the unique ability to secure more wins than anyone else and help make racial equity a reality.

Join this multi-generational network of activists dismantling structural racism by using your power to take action on the most pressing issues of our time. We have just gotten to the middle of the mountain, we need your help, and voices to continue the climb to the TOP!





Proceeds from tonight's event will directly benefit our 2022-2023 scholarship fund and other community initiatives.




### Saige Goodman


### Jullian Williams


### Chloe Tevere

President's Award







#### Madeleine Dean Congresswoman, serving Pennsylvania's 4th District

Madeleine Dean was born and raised in Glenside, Pennsylvania. She graduated from La Salle University and earned her law degree at Widener University. Madeleine then returned home and practiced law with the Philadelphia Trial Lawyers before opening a three-woman law firm in Glenside. While raising three sons, Madeleine changed career paths to become a professor of writing at La Salle University. In 2012, Madeleine successfully ran for State Representative in the 153rd District. In the legislature, Madeleine was appointed to Governor Wolf's Commission for Women, co-founded the gun safety group PA-SAFE, and was an outspoken leader on progressive issues. In 2018, Madeleine was elected to represent Pennsylvania's 4th District – Montgomery and Berks Counties – in the 116th Congress. In Washington, Madeleine serves on the powerful Judiciary and Financial Services Committees, championing priorities like public education, combating addiction, equal rights, access to healthcare, protecting the environment, ethics, criminal justice reform, gun violence prevention, and more.

In 2019, Madeleine was elected Vice-Chair of the Bipartisan Women's Caucus. In 2021, Madeleine served as an Impeachment Manager for the second impeachment of President Donald Trump.

Now in her second term, Madeleine remains focused on decency, the common good, and solutions to serve the many.

Community Service Award



#### Art Haywood PA State Senator

Art Haywood was raised by his mother, a public-school teacher, who instilled in him the value of hard work and getting a quality education. Art received his bachelor's degree from Morehouse College and graduated Magna Cum Laude. Next, Art attended the London School of Economics, as a Marshall Scholar, to complete his master's degree.

After graduating from the University of Michigan Law school in 1985, Art worked at Community Legal Services, at Regional Housing Legal Services, and in private practice as a lawyer. He also served as legal counsel to Esperanza. In 2009, Art was elected township commissioner in Cheltenham, inspired to run by President Barack Obama. After serving as president of the board, he was elected State Senator for the 4th district in 2014 and honored to serve neighbors in Northwest Philadelphia and Montgomery County.

Through his leadership as a State Senator, Art passed requirements to test for lead in water in schools; championed legislation to relocate domestic violence survivors living in public housing; and secured \$45 million in funding for violence intervention organizations to help reduce gun violence statewide. In 2021, Art fought for \$193 million in federal CARES Act funds, which helped to prevent evictions, foreclosures, and homelessness during the COVID-19 pandemic. He also served on Governor Tom Wolf's COVID-19 Vaccine Taskforce and pushed for equity in vaccine distribution in Pennsylvania. Most recently, Art organized with Black college students to end campus racism at Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education (PASSHE) universities. He was instrumental in the state legislature passing \$200 million for PASSHE in 2021, which includes funding for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion. This ensures the safety and success of Black, Brown, and White students on the 14 college campuses.

Art has three adult children and resides in Wyncote with his wife for 30 years, Julie.



### Linda Fields

Linda Fields has lived her life with a defining purpose: to serve others and to fight for what is right. She has fought for the disenfranchised and underserved her entire life. She strives to speak up for the voiceless.

She worked for 28 years as a National Organizer & Business Agent for the National Union of Hospital and Healthcare Employees, District 1199C, AFSCME, AFL-CIO until 2018. She has personally negotiated hundreds of employee contracts and served as mediator for many grievances over the years. She has successfully obtained higher and fairer wages, employee benefits and workers' rights for hospital workers for some of the largest hospital chains in Pennsylvania.

Linda formed her own non-profit called Heart to Heart Circle of Life (formerly Heart to Heart Weekend of Life) to raise money and awareness for heart disease research. Her experience as a negotiator, mediator, labor relations expert, and community advocate brings over 37 years of advocacy, love, compassion, and compromise. She has a unique ability to connect with people and build collaborative partnerships with common goals.

In 2020, Linda founded PowerUp PAC, a political action committee focused on supporting highly qualified minorities and women candidates for public office on the local and state levels. She is also the founder and CEO of PowerUp Foundation, an organization dedicated to engaging, educating and mentoring women and minorities in business development and focusing on racial and gender equality as well as voter registration and engagement in communities across the state.

She has been married for 47 years to her husband Charles and an anchor for her three children and eight grandchildren.

For Linda her time and commitment to community is what God has called her too. She has been an ordained minister since 2011; when asked what drives her to do this work she does she says... "What I do is not work, it is ministry...God's assignment".

Dr. Monica D'Antonio is a Professor of English at Montgomery County Community College, Vice President of the Norristown Area School District Board of Directors, Political Action Chair of the Greater Norristown NAACP, and Coordinator of the One Book One Norristown literacy initiative. She has a BA and MA in English from Rutgers University and a PhD in Educational Psychology from Temple University.

She is a community advocate and activist, serving as a tutor and mentor at the Center for Culture, Art, Training, and Education (CCATE), book club facilitator at Norristown Public Library, and Democratic Committee person for West Norriton 2–1.

In her free time, she loves Zumba, reading, and walking in the Norristown Farm Park. She, her husband Hal, and cat Jeter live in West Norriton.

### Nicole McGruder

Nicole McGruder is a social innovator and community organizer. She is the founder of Community Hero Action Group and Community Hero Impact Alliance. Both organizations are dedicated to decreasing health and wealth disparities in the black community with education and innovative community initiatives.

She was born in Philadelphia, PA and raised in the Bay Area in California. She obtained her undergraduate degree in English and graduate degree in Urban Planning, Design, and development from Cleveland State University.

She has had leadership roles in some of the largest healthcare organizations in the country, such as the Cleveland Clinic Foundation (Cleveland, Ohio), Kaiser Permanente (Los Angeles, CA), and Davita Dialysis (Ontario, CA and Philadelphia)

Most recently, she was the political action chair of the NAACP PA State Conference during the 2020 election season in which she coordinated census participation efforts in hard-to-count tracts, the "We are Done Dying" civil rights campaign, as well as being an integral part in the development the strategic election campaign "Wake Up Black Vote." After her term with the NAACP, she led the "Vote Today Moncto" initiative and shortly thereafter, founded Community Hero Action Group, a 501c3 dedicated to closing the disparities in health and wealth in the Black community; and also Community Hero Impact Alliance, a 501c4 focused on good government, and advocacy for legislation and policy that promotes an equitable life for the Black community. She is also the organizer of the annual Pennsylvania Health Matters Conference which provides free access to sessions developed and designed around topics germane to the Black community.


She is a God-fearing mother and wife who lives in Cheltenham, PA, enjoys traveling, and co-leading an awesome troop of Girl Scouts.


As secretary and co-political action chair of the Cheltenham Area Branch NAACP she is a mentor for the branch's Youth Leadership Committee and has collaborated with police, school boards, commissioners, and community organizations to make change.

You will see her often serving as a panelist or speaker at events, protesting in the street, and asking tough questions of our local leaders. Her data collection on the school-toprison pipeline has ignited and inspired the community to address the necessary reforms to our juvenile criminal justice system.




### Keisha Hudson-Brooks Chief Public Defender, Philadelphia PA

Keisha Hudson spent nearly eighteen years as a public defender, first with the Defender Association of Philadelphia and then as a capital appellate defender with the Federal Defender-Eastern District of Pennsylvania (Capital Habeas Unit) representing people on death row in their state post-conviction and federal habeas appeals. As a seasoned trial and appellate defender, Ms. Hudson has an in-depth understanding of what it means to be a public defender. At the Capital Habeas Unit, Ms. Hudson was the Director of Training.

In 2016, Ms. Hudson left the Federal Defender and joined the Montgomery County Office of the Public Defender Officer to become the Deputy Chief Defender. Ms. Hudson joined the Montgomery County Office of the Public Defender with the goal of building and strengthening advocacy in the courtroom. Along with former Chief Defender Dean Beer, Ms. Hudson addressed systemic issues regarding policing, pretrial detention, sentencing, and probation in the county.


In 2020, Ms. Hudson worked with The Justice Collaborative and The Appeal, developing and leading advocacy and media campaigns on criminal justice issues- specifically campaigns aimed at looking at creative and successful community alternatives that truly create public safety. From 2020 to 2021 Ms. Hudson was a visiting professor at Temple University's Beasley School of Law.
